COVID-19 RESPONSE ON CUMBRAE



A new resilience team is born!

The Millport Support Group (MSG) came into being at the beginning of the Covid-19 Pandemic and has played a significant role in assisting those who were shielding and self-isolating whilst also providing help to the community in many other ways. Although first seen as a temporary initiative, MSG has now been asked to take on the oversight of the Cumbrae Resilience Team following the retirement of Mr. Bob Campbell. His voluntary work, and that of his small team of volunteers, in helping the island over many years is truly appreciated, gratefully acknowledged and they are warmly thanked by all.

The Cumbrae Resilience Team will now be coordinated through the MSG as part of The Ayrshire Local Resilience Partnership (ALRP) and plans are currently being drawn up to coordinate the Team's civil contingencies response. They will be deployed, if requested to do so, to assist in incidences of flooding, power outage, water stoppage, or other instances that could cause community concerns.

Cumbrae Community Councillor Crawford Gillan said "CCC are delighted that we were able to facilitate the continuance of a community resilience response on the island. When communities experience disruptions, whether major incidents like Covid-19 or more localised challenges, they develop unique resources and strengths to get through. It's about supporting our community and those in it by making sensible preparations and using the local knowledge, strengths, and skills that our island residents have.

Canon Alec Boyd of Millport Churches Together said "A community's resilience is at the heart of how it survives and thrives and community resilience is everyone's business. The local churches are delighted that this team will be available to help out when circumstance dictates."

Millport Support Group Volunteer Coordinator Jackie Wilson said "We are very pleased that the island's Resilience team will be continuing to offer their assistance when required and we are looking forward to continuing to support them, and the local community in the future. This could not have happened if the Community Council had not agreed to take on the required insurance liability. We have a great team of volunteers in MSG who have shown over the last 6 months or so that they will step up and help out to ensure that in difficult times things can be made a little bit easier if we all work together."
