Thank you all everyone who came to our workshop on the 24th May, and to all those who have shared their views and opinions on the way forward for the Cumbrae WAVE. A big thank you to the Garrison House for hosting the event and for displaying the presentation in their hall for a week.



The Cumbrae WAVE was set up to try to secure a Community Asset Transfer of the old Watersports centre, which would have kept it available for the community. A community asset transfer has to show that it is financially secure, and we were unable to do this so unfortunately the transfer application failed.

During the workshop, 19 participants talked about the future of the Watersports Centre and its land, and discussed the potential for the different activities that were envisioned in the centre, such as: water sports, health & wellbeing, youth indoor activities, tourism information.

This raised the questions:

Is there a demand for these activities?Can we deliver them elsewhere on the island?Who would run them?

The next step for The Cumbrae WAVE is to see if and how the charity can help to develop these activities on the island.

Carbon Neutral Cumbrae

Cumbrae has been selected to be part of the Scottish Government Carbon Neutral Islands project, along with Hoy, Islay, Raasay, Barra and Yell, with a commitment to support the island to become carbon neutral by 2040. A report on the project will be published in the summer and plans will be developed in collaboration with key partners and local communities. The project will align with a Scotland-wide net zero initiative and contribute to the Scottish government's 2045 net zero commitment. Good practices and lessons learned from the project will be shared with the other Scottish islands.

John McHenery, Deputy Chair of Cumbrae Community Council (CCC) said: "CCC is proud that our island has been selected as the North Ayrshire representative in this national project. We look forward to working with the other islands and taking it forward within the Cumbrae development plan. Once initial audits, assessments and consultations are complete we will be better placed with the people of the island to plan the way forward to achieve carbon neutrality appropriate for Cumbrae."

Welcoming Ukrainian Families to Millport

Since Russia's invasion of Ukraine, more than 13 million Ukrainians have fled their homes, with almost 5 million leaving for neighbouring countries. Around 115,000 have arrived in the UK - some with family visas and others under the Homes for Ukraine and Scotland's Super Sponsor schemes, which enable individuals and community groups to host an individual or family.

The Cumbrae community has stepped up to help and today there are 4 Ukrainian families being hosted in Millport while another 2 families await their visas. Anna and her 5 year-old son Lev were the first family to arrive on the island.



Anna says "I took the difficult decision to leave our home in the eastern part of Ukraine on 7th March to protect and save my little boy. It took us a week to cross to the western border of Ukraine, where we travelled into Romania and waited for a month for our visas to be issued. Eventually on 19th of April we found our second home here in your community. Isle of Cumbrae is an absolutely beautiful place to live. It's very cosy and safe, especially for children. Lev loves to ride his bike along the beach. He enjoys playing with his new friends from nursery and can't wait to join Primary One in August".

On behalf of all Ukrainian families living in Millport, Anna would like to thank the community for such a warm welcoming reception. "We thank all people for their kindness and help provided to us on an everyday basis. With your support, attention and endless efforts to make this integration easy and comfortable for all of us, we feel welcomed and very much accepted. Thank you a lot!"
