COVID-19 vaccinations are under way on the island with the over-80's first to get their jabs in January from Cumbrae Medical Practice at Garrison House, followed by the over-65's at the DA Hall by a Health Board team on Saturday 6th Feb.

The DA Hall vaccination event had been brought forward from the original date of 17th February, but the blue appointment envelopes landed on island doormats just in time. Big thanks go to our posties for a magnificent effort on one of the worst days of the year and with 2 days-worth of mail to deliver due to the ferry being off the previous day!

An update from Angie and the Town Hall team:

We are so delighted to tell you all that we have received an award of £1.5 million from the Scottish Government for the regeneration of Millport Town Hall. Together with the funding already secured from the North Ayrshire Council Community Investment Fund, Crown Estates, Scottish Land Trust, CARS, the Sir Hugh Fraser Foundation, the Islands Green Recovery Programme, Sir Boyd Tunnock and of course from local fundraising events, it brings us close enough to the £2m costs of Phase 1 to go ahead with building work. As we've already completed detailed building surveys, we'll soon be tendering for contractors to start in May and we're encouraging loca



Phase 1 is a complete overhaul of the building along with the addition of three holiday flats to make the project financially sustainable into the future. There will be an atrium extension to the side for the main access and lifts installed.

In a historic first online episcopal election, the Diocese of Argyll & The Isles has chosen a new Bishop.

The Rev Canon Dr Keith Riglin was selected by the Electoral Synod from a short-list of three candidates, and will fill the vacancy brought about by the translation of the Rt Rev Kevin Pearson to the Diocese of Glasgow & Galloway last year. The successful outcome also means that the College of Bishops will now have a full complement of seven Bishops for the first time since 2016.

The Bishop-elect is Vice Dean and Chaplain at King's College London, where he is also a Visiting Lecturer in the Department of Theology and Religious Studies. He also serves as Assistant Priest at St Anne's Church, Soho and as an Authorised Presbyter at Wesley's Chapel, London.

After his election, he said: "I am delighted and deeply touched to be elected as Bishop."This is such an important time for our communities and churches. I'm humbled by the confidence placed in me, and look forward to all that God may do."
