## Cumbrae Forum Update

Like any organisation the Cumbrae Forum has been evolving over the years. What started as a group protesting the closure of the island Care Homes has become a charity who, over the years, has been supporting the community and speaking up for the vulnerable.

A lot of what was done was unseen. Increasingly the Forum Charity shop/office had become a drop in centre for people looking for support and advice, or just a friendly chat.

Lockdown emphasised to us the need for a place to formalise our work. We had come to a crossroads where we had outgrown our shop with small office and identified the need for a designated office, separate from the shop, where confidential issues could be more appropriately dealt with.

When the opportunity of buying a property arose our members voted unanimously to this next step. Our new property at 45 Stuart Street is just about to open. This is your property too. The success of our Charity Shop has allowed us to make this move. And without your support we couldn't move forward.







This last year has been challenging and we have supported several individuals, as well as continuing our commitment to support our local Primary school. Known for our support of the elderly, our Lunch Club, which is held on a Wednesday at The Newton, is a huge success. Our support of young folk is less well known but just as important to us. We are committed to supporting Cumbrae Primary School whenever we can.

None of this progress would be possible without your support. And so, it is with grateful thanks to our community, that we open our new Forum Hub in April. A special thank you to all our volunteers in the shop and at the Lunch Club. We couldn't do this without you all. You are amazing! And to all who went ahead of us paving the way for us to do what we do now, a special thank you from us all.

### Cumbrae Primary School

We are all delighted that we have been back in school with no disruption to our normal school week and no lockdowns.

In February we held our very successful Scottish Poetry, Music and Art competitions. The children were fantastic and their art work is currently on display in the Garrison. While our main focus is always Literacy and Numeracy we are lucky in Cumbrae Primary to develop these skills in many ways other than through textbooks. This session all classes experienced weekly outdoor learning activities with the FSC for 15 weeks where we learned about our local environment and sustainability. We were den building, creating insect houses, learning about plants, sea creatures and it was lots of fun.

P6/7 have been working with a local author for a 10 week project writing about our island, creating artwork and learning photography skills. A presentation of our work will be displayed in the Garrison after Easter and we will also be producing a book of our work which can be purchased.

Our pupil voice groups have started up again and our main ones are pupil council, eco council and digital leaders. Our pupil council is going to focus on improving our playground further with more games, furniture and hopefully a reading den. Our digital leaders will help promote internet safety and aim to achieve the primary school digital leadership award and our eco council is going to oversee the introduction of chickens to our school. We have been awarded a grant to promote sustainability so we are all going to learn from Nursery to P7 how to look after chickens, collect eggs and cook with eggs. If you're lucky enough we might have eggs left over to let you try!

We have also been awarded a government grant from the Healthy Islands fund and are hoping to build an outdoor classroom in the church grounds next to our garden so we can be outside even more. The Cumbrae Forum is also providing a substantial donation to help this project come alive and we are very grateful. The community will be able to use this too and hopefully we will be able to restart our community café again.

Our P5/6/7 have had swimming lessons over 5 weeks at Vikingar funded kindly by The Cumbrae Forum.

We are also planning a school show this year, Alice in Wonderland produced by Mrs Joyce. Practices are already underway and hopefully we will be able to share this with the community on stage in June.
